CONSISTORY

This is the second part of the Templar Degrees of the Scottish Rite, written by Pierre G. "Pete" Normand, Jr., 33° as published in the Fall 2008 Plumblin of the Scottish Rite Research Society.

31st Degree: Grand Inspector Inquisitor Commander. This is the second of the three "Kadosh Degrees" of the Scottish Rite. In The Manifesto of 1802, this degree, along with the 30th and 32nd were listed simply as "Prince of the Royal Secret." The Degree has always been utilized as a final test of the candidate before he is elevated to the Degree of Master of the Royal Secret. After the suppression of the Templars, it was imperative that the fugitive knight seeking refuge in a Templar asylum be tested fully to separate him from the enemies of the Order. In one early version of the Degree, the candidate was tested in his knowledge of the eight degrees of Entered Apprentice, Fellowcraft, Master Mason, Master Elect, Scottish Master, Knight of the East, Knight Rose Croix, and Knight Kadosh, before being permitted to advance. Today, the Rite utilizes Egyptian mythology as an allegory of the final judgment.

32nd Degree: Master of the Royal Secret. The third of the "Kadosh Degrees" of the Rite, its object is to gather the degrees of the Scottish Rite in the Symbolic Camp. The costume of a Master of the Royal Secret is that of a Knight Kadosh, and the Knights Kadosh are the legitimate successors of the Knights Templar. The distinctive Scottish Rite cap is that of a Kadosh of the 32nd Degree. In Legend A of the 32nd Degree we are taught that "only by constant labor in the daily walks of life...can the Knights Kadosh

become the true soldiery of the Holy House of the Temple of Solomon." In "The Readings of the 32nd Degree" we find "The Templar Dogma," wherein is explained the war *à outrance* between Light and Darkness.

33rd Degree: Inspector General. Conferred only by the Supreme Council, 33°, the Degree of Inspector General is a Templar Degree throughout, in both substance and symbolism. The officers of the Supreme Council are the officers of a Grand Preceptory of Knights Templar presided over by the Grand Commander. The Symbol of the Grand Commander, the Salem Cross with crosslets, is the symbol of the Grand Master of the Knights Templar. That the Scottish Rite is the spiritual descendant of "The Poor Fellow Soldiery of the Temple of Solomon" (the Knights Templar), is best betrayed, however, in the full name of "The Supreme Council (Mother Council of the World) of the Inspectors General *Knights Commanders of the House of the Temple of Solomon* of the Thirty-Third Degree of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry of the Southern Jurisdiction of the United States of America."

Masonic Trivia

This information will be provided to and **is required** by the Navy for every person that is passing through the main gate to attend the festivities. If the person is too young to have a driver's license then enter **Minor** in place of the driver's license.

Masonic Dictionary

Dew of Hermon - The dews of Mount Hermon, and of Palestine in general, were sources of irrigation, fertilization and refreshment for vegetation and agricultural growth. The phrase is employed as a symbolic expression of the bedewing influences of Divine Grace.

Golden Fleece - An honorary order of knighthood instituted by Philip the Good of Burgundy in 1429.

Speculative Masonry meets Operative Masonry

Records in the Grand Lodge of Scotland Museum indicate that Bro. George Washington recruited six Masons from Edinburgh, Scotland to help build the White House in Washington, DC. All six became founding members of the Federal Masonic Lodge #1 of Washington D.C. One of these Brethren was none other than Bro. James Hoban, who built the United States Capitol and the White House. He was a devout Catholic and ardent Mason. Federal Lodge #1 was formed under his leadership by a group of Irish Catholics and Scotch Presbyterians. Bro. James Hoban was the first Worshipful Master of Federal Lodge #1.

The first account of a corner-stone ceremony appeared in *Mist's Weekly* on 26 May 1722, in conjunction with the building of St. Martin in the Field Church. The first stone was laid by the Bishop of Salisbury. The official account was as follows: "That it being a royal parish church, King George I sent his

Lord Almoner and Surveyor General attended by Brother Gib, (the architect of that great pile), with many freemasons in solemn procession from the palace to level the foot stone of the southeast corner by giving it three great knocks with a mallet in the King's name, and laying upon it a purse of one hundred guineas. When the trumpeters sounded all joined in joyful acclamations and the Craftsmen went to the Tavern to drink a toast to the King and the Craft."

Alexi maintained a 3.96 Accumulated GPA, participated in three varsity sports and one recreational sport and team captain on two teams, a member of five school organizations with leadership positions in four of them, worked in several community service projects and events, prolific in many Advanced and AP classes, and the recipient of several personal awards. In addition, her teacher recommendations were greater than outstanding.

Illustrious Wayne Smith and David McCuiston attended Cascade's Scholarship night and made the presentation. In addition to the Scottish Rite Scholarship, Alexi received several other monetary scholarships, totaling over \$200,000. She is certainly one smart young lady. As a side-note, scholarships at Cascade High School that night totaled \$2,069,000.00, spread among several students.

License to Care

Many people are not aware of the Scottish Rite's "**Rite Care**" Program, which helps children with speech problems. Right Care Clinics with their speech therapists have helped children, marginalized by their inability to communicate, to learn to speak and return to the mainstream in their schools and neighborhoods. This takes a lot of money to accomplish. One unique way to do this is by the "**Help Kids Speak**" Masonic license plates.

You may notice from time to time, a license plate on a car with a Square and Compass and a vertical M M on it. That is the "Help Kids Speak" plate. All of the profits/proceeds (\$28.00 per plate annually at renewal) goes to the Rite Care program.

It is easy to get and you don't even have to wait for your renewal date. Go to the DOL office in your neighborhood and request a "Help Kids Speak" plate, pay the fee and you, too, will be able to drive with pride as a Mason, joining the 1,697 others licensed to care, on the road helping kids speak.

2009 OES CHARITY GOLF TOURNAMENT

Plans are underway for the 2009 OES Charity Golf Tournament. The tournament this year will support the Washington's RiteCare Program (previously known as the Scottish Rite Centers for Childhood Language Disorders) Endowment Fund. As a participant in any one or all of the eight previous tournaments we invite you to join the fun again this August.

The tournament will be held again at Whispering Firs Golf Course on McChord Air Force Base near Tacoma. The date is Friday, August 14th with a shotgun start at 1:00 PM. As we've done the last three years gate passes will have to be issued for those with no military ID. Civilians please include your Driver's License number and Date of Birth on the registration form so the passes may be issued.

Everyone must have a gate pass to be allowed on Fort Lewis. A **FIRM** deadline of Friday, July 31st must be adhered to so the passes & maps can be mailed in time for the tournament. The tournament is open to the first 144 golfers with paid registration—payment in full must be received to confirm registration. The tournament will use a "four person scramble" format.

Check in at the registration table will begin at 10:00 AM. Coffee and goodies will be available.

Golfers can come early and enjoy a free bucket of balls at the driving range. The putting contest will run from 10 AM until the tournament begins. There is a Mexican restaurant at the golf course where lunch can be purchased; a Burger King is located about ½ mile from the golf course on base or bring your own lunch. Complimentary cold water will be available on the course as well as a beverage cart to purchase drinks of your choice.

After golfing you can enjoy a BBQ of either steak or chicken (indicate which you'd like on the registration form) and trimmings. A count has to be turned in so no changing your mind the day of.

Dessert will be apple or berry pie provided by Shari's Restaurant. Spouses and/or friends are welcome to come for the BBQ only at a cost of \$15.00 per person with the same deadline as the golfer registration (July 31st). BBQ tickets will need to be picked up at the registration area on tournament day.

The tournament fee remains the same as previous tournaments: \$75.00 for golfing, which includes green fees, cart, BBQ and prizes. Prizes will be awarded to the top teams as well as longest drive and closest to the pin for women and men. Awards will be after the BBQ.

Teams may choose to play either 9 or 18 holes. Please be sure you indicate this on the registration form. Gather up your team members from last year or form a new team or if you'd like we'll place individuals together to form a team. Please join us in this noble cause and have fun at the same time.

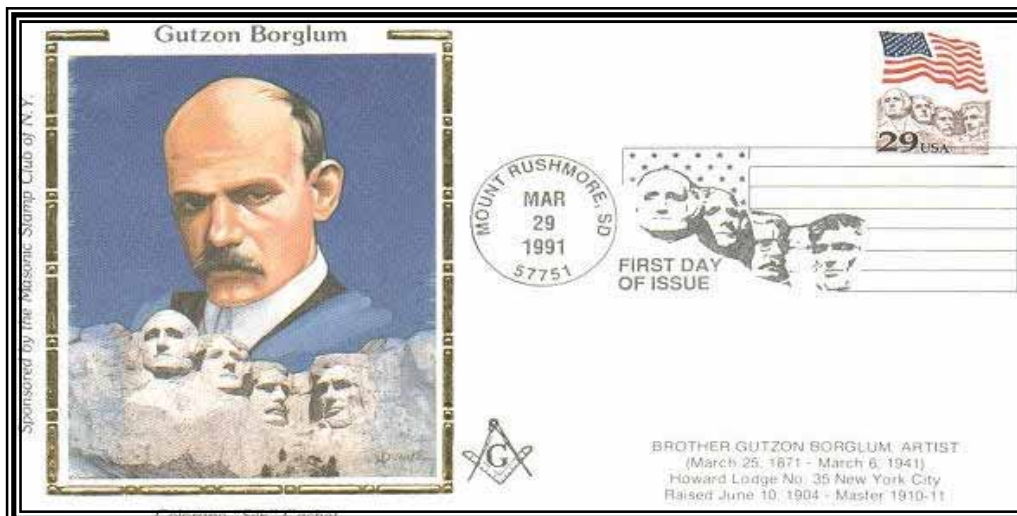
